The student will follow written instructions to produce documents and present data based on real world scenarios. Students will read and understand implied messages to understand how the skills in each project might be applied in real life.

They seek new methods, practices and ideas from a variety of sources and seek to apply those ideas to their own workplace. They take action on their ideas and understand how to bring innovation to an organization. The student plans and produces much of the content. Skill building occurs within each unit.

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8	Utilize critical thinking to make sense of problems and persevere in solving them : Career-ready individuals readily recognize problems in the workplace, understand the nature of the problem, and devise effective plans to solve the problem. They are aware of problems when they occur and take action quickly to address the problem. They thoughtfully investigate the root cause of the problem prior to introducing solutions. They carefully consider the options to solve the problem. Once a solution is agreed upon, they follow through to ensure the problem is solved, whether through their own actions or the actions of others. The student carefully plans the end product using the planning form provided. The student will identify the task outcome and be able to troubleshoot and revise along the way.

Students are not only required to demonstrate knowledge of business applications software, but apply that knowledge in each assigned task. If the student has used different software in the past, he/she must be flexible and open to change in learning the new program. Through experimentation and inquiry, the student will apply alternative ways to get the job done correctly and efficiently.
